The Liberty Tree

at the National Heritage Museum

The Museum invites you to pay tribute to a loved one past or present, or honor a special person in your life by adding their name to a leaf on the Liberty Tree. The Liberty Tree memorial, together with the Liberty Tree Book of Honor, is a meaningful way to recognize someone who has impacted your life. It is also an opportunity to call attention to someone who may have been forgotten with time, and is a lasting tribute to the one you honor. Acknowledging or commemorating someone special during this season can add a unique touch to the holidays, or make a very special gift.

The Liberty Tree is on permanent display in the Museum's Lobby. The name of your honoree will be displayed on a leaf for a period of up to three months. A page dedicated to the honoree will be permanently kept in the Liberty Tree Book of Honor and Remembrance. The Book will become part of the Museum's Library collection.
